

# Remote Learning at The James Oglethorpe Primary School

## What 'remote learning' can my child expect?

This information is to be used as a general guide, parents can expect further details of remote learning for their child as, and when it is required. We aim to implement remote learning from your child's second day of absence.

There are two general scenarios outlined below; the first scenario where your child is not permitted to attend school due to self-isolating and the second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school. ### **Remote Learning**

My child (and their siblings if they are also attending JOPS) is absent because they are awaiting test results and our household is required to self-isolate.

Work for each subject will be posted on Google classroom by the end of the first day of isolation. The teaching slides the teacher is using in class are posted, for the pupil to follow. they include instructions and information as well as questions for the pupil to think about, in the same way they would do in class. The slides will then highlight what the independent task is for the pupils to complete. The task may be on the slides or attached to the google classroom separately.

Pupils can complete work on paper or in their homework book if it is at home, however we encourage that any written work is completed directly onto the google classroom if using a tablet or a computer. If your child completes their work on paper, they should take a photograph of their work on a smartphone or tablet and upload it to the google classroom.

We have a responsibility as a school to monitor the quality of home learning, so it is essential we see what the pupils have completed and give them next steps and feedback. If pupils have any difficulty completing work, they can post questions on the google classroom, or alternatively send an email to the school office and an adult will endeavour to call you as soon as possible.

My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19.

We enter another 'Lockdown' with **total** school closure.

Daily Remote Lessons via Google Classroom – this will consist of some recorded presentations by the class teacher, written instructions and presentations. Again work can be completed directly onto the Google classroom, or photos of written work uploaded.

There will be at least one recorded maths or English lesson on the google classroom per day and one recorded foundation subject per week.

Work will be uploaded daily by 9am

A timetable with suggested timings will be displayed for parents to use if they wish. The classroom will be regularly monitored, so if pupils have any questions about the work set, they can post them onto the classroom and a teacher will get in touch.

The quantity of tasks will be dependent on the age/stage of your child, and you will receive more specific information about work set in the event that your child's bubble was to close.

Your child will receive a weekly welfare call from a member of school staff, however if there are any pressing questions about the work or your child's needs then either post onto the google classroom or email the school office and their class teacher will be in touch as soon as possible.

**Parents of pupils with 1:1 adults:** your child will receive personalised work and learning where necessary. Your child's 1:1 adult will be in touch to explain this in more detail.

If for any reason your child has no device at home to access Google classroom on to view the work set. Please inform Mrs Wagstaff as soon as possible via the school office.
