Mrs Ciobanu and her crisp packet sleeping bag venture

As the cold weather approaches, I would like to attempt making crisp packet blankets and sleeping bag covers for the homeless. I am a novice at this but would like to give it a go. I used to work in a homeless shelter and hand out blankets, but they got wet and heavy so this seems like something that would help keep sleeping bags drier and people potentially warmer. Please start to send in your crisp packets once a week. I will set up crisp packet bins that the packets can go into. Any crisp packets are suitable – to make life easier please cut them open on a long edge and wipe them clean. Each blanket takes around 44 crisp packets to create, while the sleeping bags take 150 so let's get saving. Thank you for your support with this.

COVID - PCR testing and Close Contact Information

If your child has symptoms or you have been requested to get a PCR if you have been a close contact then we would advise you to visit a walk in or drive in site rather than sending off for a postal test. You are able to get an appointment very easily for the walk in and drive in sites and you receive the results much quicker than the postal tests. If your child have been a close contact and have no symptoms then they do not need to isolate whilst waiting for the result however, if they have symptoms then they do. Getting the results sooner may mean your child can return to school sooner and if it did show positive results we can alert others and possibly stop the spread sooner.
