
Welcome to Year 2 - Sept 2024



Home-learning in Year 2

<u>Weekly spellings</u> - given out on Tuesday to be practised at home with an adult; test in school the following Tuesday.

<u>Numbots</u> - we recommend that children practice for at least 20 minutes a week (can be broken into smaller sessions). This will help your child with the basic skills of addition and subtraction.

Reading - We encourage parents to read with their children at home daily. There will be no expectation to record this in reading records however if you would like to use the record to write a comment that would be great. This year we have also decided to remove extrinsic 'rewards' for reading however we will be arranging a number of school events linked to reading for pleasure which we will contact you about in the near future.
