
#### Welcome to Year 4 - Sept 2024

#### Home-learning in Year 4



<u>Weekly spellings</u> - given out on Wednesday to be practised on Spelling Shed; test in school the following Wednesday.

<u>TT Rockstars</u> - we recommend that children practice for at least 20 minutes a week (can be broken into smaller sessions). Children who know their times tables well are able to learn the Year 4 Maths objectives with far greater ease.

**Reading** - we encourage parents to read with their children at home daily. There will be no expectation to record this in reading records, however if you would like to use the record to write a comment that would be great. This year we have also decided to remove extrinsic 'rewards' for reading, however we will be arranging a number of school events linked to reading for pleasure which we will contact you about in the near future.
